A Century – Bea S. McPherson



On December 18, 2021, Bea S. McPherson became a century – 100 years! What a wonderful celebration with family, friends, and several AMS and NGAA members attending Bea's birthday celebration with Zoom!

Bea was featured on the cover of her local newspaper "The Hartville News."

During WWII following graduation from Kent State University, Bea stated "If I couldn't join the military, I decided I was going to help the war effort as a civilian." The Army Map Service (AMS) was losing much of its male workforce to the armed forces. With the increasing demand for current maps that could be distributed quickly to soldiers at the fronts, Bea among several other women from Kent State University traveled east being assigned as a "Drafter" working in the camouflaged Ruth Building. The women who updated maps for the military became known as Military Mapping Maidens (MMM) or 3Ms. Bea worked on maps used for D-Day with troops landing on Omaha and Utah beaches.

Eventually Bea and her husband, Bill McPherson, moved back to Hartville Ohio where she became a 3rd grade teacher. Bea became a legal assistant with her husband's law firm while raising 3 children.

December 2013, which began AMS 40th Anniversary, Bea was AMS's guest speaker at our Holiday luncheon and submitted an article for the 40th Anniversary brochure. The Pathfinder Winter 2014 edition featured the Military Mapping Maidens'

In January 2014, Bea was invited to NGA celebrating Women's History Month and meeting then-NGA director Letitia Long. Ms. Long presented Bea with a NGA medallion, typically given only to dignitaries, and in a follow-up note the director wrote, "You were truly a pioneer who paved the way for women to enter the field of cartography." "It was quite an honor to be called a pioneer mapmaker," Bea McPherson says. "Until then, I hadn't realized that's what I was!"

Two years later in 2016, she received a letter from the current NGA director, Robert Cardillo, informing her that the Military Mapping Maidens had been selected for induction into the Geospatial-Intelligence Hall of Fame. Bea attended the ceremony accepting this honor for all Military Mapping Maidens!

Thank you, Bea, for paving the way for many future women expanding their careers at NGA!!

Some Sources and Ideas for Managing Stress Associated with the COVID-19 Pandemic

Cornell University’s Faculty and Staff Assistance Program: “Coping With the COVID-19 Pandemic” <https://fsap.cornell.edu/sites/fsap/files/pdfs/Coping-with-the-COVID-19-pandemic.pdf>. A one-page list of ideas for coping with the pandemic that includes: (*Remember to talk first with your doctor about the types and amounts of physical activity right for you*):

- Remain informed of current events by way of reliable and accurate sources, but do not immerse yourself. Limit your exposure to news outlets and social media (e.g., 10 minutes in the morning, and 10 minutes at night, or whatever works with your obligations.) The key is to not allow the media to consume you but rather to adequately inform you.
- Be mindful of what you can and cannot control. Practice healthy precautions that have been offered by medical experts, as this guidance is the most effective way to manage your health.
- When feeling overwhelmed by the enormity of the moment, turn to your “cognitive side” (i.e., return to focusing on facts and not all of the “what ifs”). This is the time to use your scientific mind, thereby carefully reserving your emotional energy for times that matter most.
- Rest, eat well, and move your body – always go back to basics when everything feels chaotic. You can stay active indoors by exercising, or perhaps cleaning or rearranging your environment. You might consider using more free time to cook those longer recipes or finish a home project. And the great outdoors is still available to you – run, bike, walk or simply spend time sitting outside enjoying the sunshine when you can.
- It is okay to indulge in watching your favorite TV shows, movies or reading an entertaining book!
- If you’re home with kids, consider creating a schedule to follow during the day – this could include things like mealtimes, reading, drawing, and writing, etc. Indeed, it is best that we all continue with a routine as this form of structure and predictability affords us a sense of routine and normalcy.
- Remember: you are functioning under unfamiliar circumstances and therefore your expectations surrounding your performance should be adjusted accordingly. Truly commend yourself for striving to do your best!
- Keep your social connections intact as social support is overall the most effective way to manage stress. Our age of technology allows for so many creative ways to remain in touch with our friends,

family, and neighbors. Share your stories, concerns, and laughter


