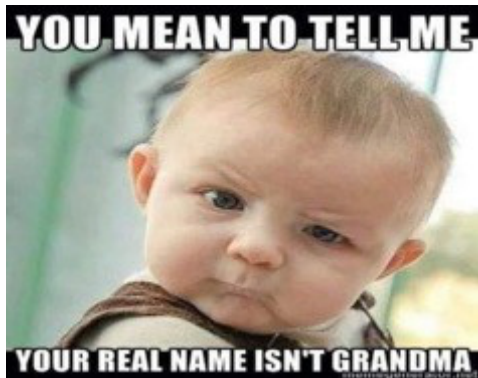

AMS Anniversary Celebration

Throughout 2024, the Association of Mapping Seniors will celebrate our **50th Anniversary** helping members “keeping in touch and having fun!” The AMS 50th Anniversary Committee plans to include an emphasis in each sponsored event this year information or activities celebrating people and events in the Association’s past, present and future.

AMS 50th Anniversary Timeline – The year-long AMS 50th Anniversary celebration begins at the December 6, 2023, annual AMS Holiday Luncheon and concludes at our December 4, 2024, AMS Holiday Luncheon.

As our members are scattered across 38 of these United States, it is likely that not everyone can attend the in-person events. Accordingly, we are planning for some online activities to enable members to participate from wherever they are living. The first such online activity planned is the “**AMS Storybook**.”

The **AMS Storybook** will be written by you! Yes, we are asking you the AMS members to submit a story from your experience working at any of the predecessor organizations that now comprise the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA). Of course, *all stories submitted are required to be **entirely unclassified***, and short with between 300-350 words total. Story content must also be appropriate for the Association, not libelous, and consistent with the AMS By-Laws, history, and purpose. Please submit your story online via email to mappingseniors@outlook.com and include “Storybook” in the Subject line.* The outline for submitted stories is:

- Your name.
- The year you started, the agency name at that time, and the department/office you were originally assigned.
- Your story, e.g., “What was your favorite “job” at the agency and why?” or an “interesting story you would like to share.”
- The year, the agency name, and the department/office when you retired.

Plans are to periodically post stories throughout the year, so we will begin accepting submissions for review in early December. If all goes well, at the conclusion of the AMS 50th Anniversary celebration, we plan to produce a special online edition of the AMS News containing the entire approved AMS 50th Anniversary Storybook content. No hardcopy is currently planned for production.

AMS Website – A new website design is in work to support the AMS 50th Anniversary celebration (and beyond). Until the new website debuts (planned for December 2023/January 2024), please continue checking our current website and follow us on Facebook for the latest on the Anniversary activities.

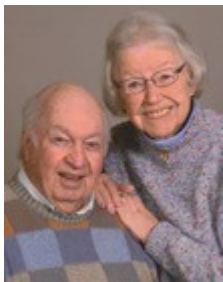
