James "Jim" Elmore Clem, 82, of Murrells Inlet, SC, formerly of Leesburg, VA, died on Friday, January 26, 2024. He was born in Floyd, VA, on January 6, 1942, to the late Willis Covet Clem and Virginia Perrien (Cannaday) Clem. Surviving is his loving wife of 58 years, Connie Leigh Clem of

Murrells Inlet; daughter Stacy Lynn Skinner and son-in-law Douglas Paul Skinner of Leesburg, VA; granddaughter Kiley Anne Kirkpatrick and her husband Raymond "Austin" Kirkpatrick of Purcellville, VA; great granddaughter Savannah Rae Kirkpatrick; and great grandson Raymond "Mack" Kirkpatrick. He is preceded in death by his brother Richard Clem and stepbrother Herman Clem.

Jim's career was very varied in that he retired in 1996 after 37 years as a Cartographer Program Manager at the former Defense Mapping Agency in Washington, D.C., and then became the owner of Colonial Funeral Home of Leesburg from 1996 to 2013. From 2010 to the present, he served as Vice President of Business Development at SCS Safety Health and Security Associates LLC of Leesburg, VA.

Jim was a very generous man with his time and talents. He served his community in a variety of ways, no matter where he lived. He was appointed to the Leesburg Town Council in 1987 and was subsequently elected to a four-year term in 1990 and served as Vice Mayor until July 1992. He was first elected as Mayor in 1992 and was re-elected three

times, May 1994, 1996, and 1998. He continued his service to the Town as the Leesburg District representative on the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors from 2003 to 2007.

Jim was an active member of the Leesburg community beyond politics. He was a Life Member and Past President with the Leesburg Volunteer Fire Company. Also, he was a Life Member of the Olive Branch Masonic Lodge #114 in Leesburg, VA, and a member of the Leesburg Hosts Lion Club for many years.

After moving to Murrells Inlet, SC in 2009, Jim became active in community and church activities. He served on the Links Brook community's Architectural Review Committee and for many years on the Board of Directors of the Property Owners Association. Every Sunday he would greet everyone at the side door of the Surfside United Methodist Church with a smile and a comment about something relevant to each person. He was a "people" person through and through, and never met a "fencepost" that he would not talk to.

A Celebration of Life will be held at Surfside United Methodist Church, 800 13th Avenue North, Surfside Beach, SC 29575 on Saturday, February 17, 2024, at 11:00 AM, with a reception to follow in the Fellowship Hall. Robert Ramirez Arias, age 89, passed away peacefully on Monday, June 21, 2021, surrounded by family in his final moments. Robert accredited his long life to his wife Victoria Bueno Arias, married over 61 glorious years as he would often say she always cared for him very well. An

amazing husband, father, son, brother, Marine, mentor and friend to all.

Career: After graduating from Fox Tech High School in May 1949, Robert started working at Edgar Tobin Aerial Surveys as a topographic map draftsman. With the United States' entry into the Korean War, Robert joined the United States Marine Corps on June 1,

1950 as he felt the call of duty to serve his country. After completing boot camp, the U.S. Marines deployed him to fight in the Korean War as a machine gunner. Robert was immediately thrown into combat on September 15, 1950, as part of the amphibious beach invasion at the Battle of Inchon, then again on October 26, 1950 in another beach landing at Wonsan. On November 27, 1950, after one of the bloodiest battles in U.S. Marine Corps history, Robert was captured by the North Koreans and Chinese forces at the Chosin Reservoir - Hill 1282 and became a prisoner of war (POW) until the armistice was signed July 27, 1953. He was subsequently released in mid-August 1953 after approximately 32 ½ months as a POW, weighing less than 100 pounds. Robert became a cartographer for the Department of Defense (DOD) working for the Army Map Service, subsequently known as the Defense Mapping Agency at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio Texas. He later accepted a position with the DOD working for the Inter-American Geodetic Survey (IAGS). In that role, he was part of an effort to prepare the first detailed maps of the country of Paraguay for the IAGS as well as leading instruction in cartography to its governmental officials so they could maintain those maps into the future. Robert's last tour of duty before retirement from the DOD in 1986 was teaching cartography at the IAGS Cartographic School in the Panama Canal Zone at Fort Clayton where he became an instructor. A short time after his retirement from the DOD, Robert obtained his real estate license.

Personal Life: Born on October 10, 1931, Robert and his family traveled for work with the IAGS to Paraguay in the late 1960's, returning to San Antonio in the early 1970's. Upon returning stateside, Robert continued his work with DOD, raising his children with his wife. Robert is survived by his loving wife of over 61 years, Victoria Bueno Arias; son, John Joseph Arias; daughter, Diana Jo Arias; grandchildren, great grandchildren, sister, Ana Hernandez; brother, Roy Ramirez Arias; and numerous sisters in-laws, a brother in-law, nieces, nephews, friends and extended family on both sides.
