- Your name.
- The year you started, the agency name at that time, and the department/office you were originally assigned.
- Your story, e.g., "What was your favorite "job" at the agency and why?" or an "interesting story you would like to share."
- The year, the agency name, and the department/office when you retired.

Thank you for the many folks who have submitted their short stories for the Storybook. The Committee has read very interesting stories and it's nice walking down memory lane as the stories are read for content. Very soon, these stories will be on the AMS website.

Plans are to periodically post stories throughout the year. If all goes well, at the conclusion of the AMS 50th Anniversary celebration, we plan to produce a special online edition of the AMS News containing the entire approved AMS 50th Anniversary Storybook content. No hardcopy is currently planned for production.

The large open dining area encouraged us to talk with folks at every table since attendees could easily move around. A good time was had by all attendees.



The entrées of Fish and Chips, Chicken pot pie, or Reuban Combo were delicious.


